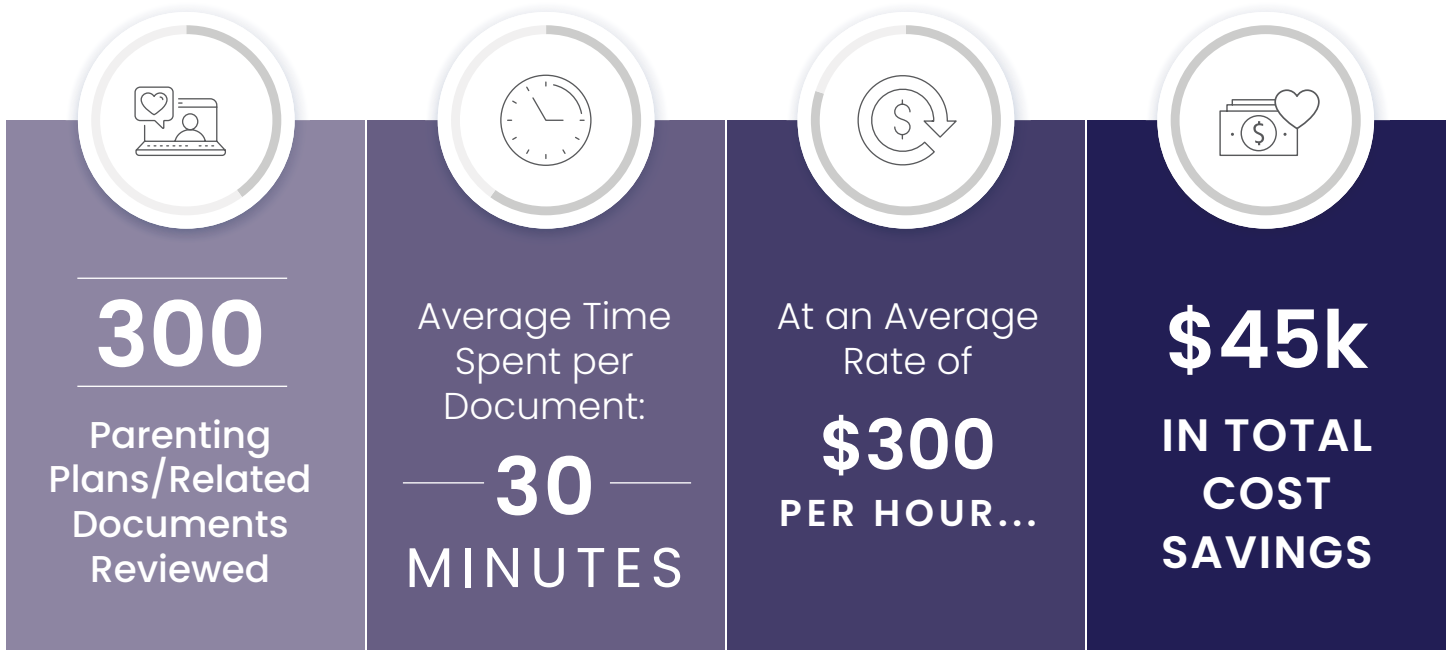

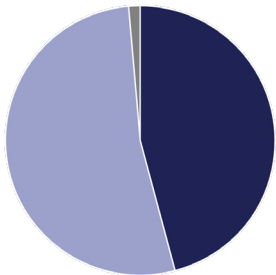

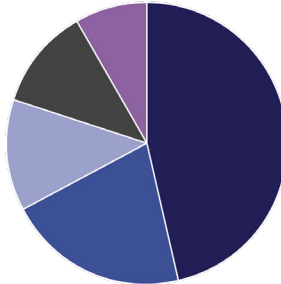

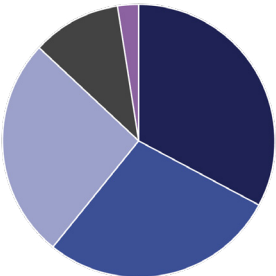

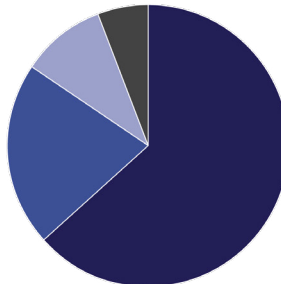

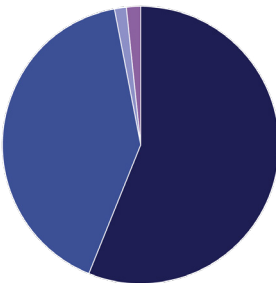

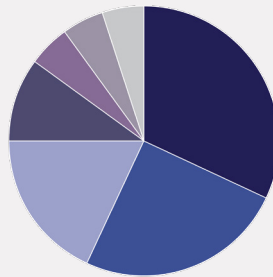
WHAT AREA OF OCHR.ORG RESOURCES CAN BE MOST USEFUL TO YOU?

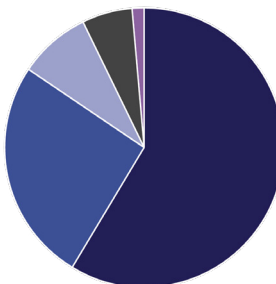

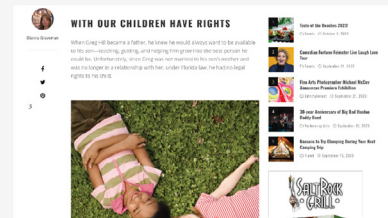
